Teachers, Outreach Program Educators, and Ojibwe Knowledge Keepers from Minnesota and Wisconsin

What

Sail aboard the three-masted schooner S/V Denis Sullivan from St. Ignace, Michigan, through the Soo Locks into Duluth, Minnesota, just in time for the Parade of Tall Ships

- Learn about Great Lake tribal approaches to natural resource management and research incorporating Traditional Ecological Knowledge, Ojibwe cultural relationships to water, and western science:
- Gain understanding about Tribal Treaty Rights, history of tribes along the Great Lakes, and comanagement efforts along Lake Superior and Lake Michigan;
- Learn about the importance of Ojibwe cultural relationships to the ecology of aquatic species, • land, water, and air;
- Gain an understanding of Great Lakes ecology and water quality and get hands-on experience monitoring water quality and biota;
- Leave with exemplary curricula and resources;
- Become part of a community of educators, outreach professionals, scientists, and managers focused on increasing Great Lakes and traditional knowledge literacy;
- Become eligible for small grants and monitoring equipment loans to implement what you've learned in your own teaching;
- Receive ongoing communication and support from Sea Grant and Fond du Lac education specialists;
- Housing and meals provided aboard the S/V Denis Sullivan; \$250 stipend for expenses •

Meet in Duluth, MN. Take a charter bus to St. Ignace, MI with a stop to learn from the Great Lakes Indian Fish and Wildlife Commission* in Odanah, WI. Board the ship at St. Ignace, MI, and sail and learn on our way back to Duluth, MN.
