Learn how to develop pollinator habitat with engaging interdisciplinary activities for establishing, managing, and monitoring prairie habitat suitable for monarch butterflies, other insect pollinators, and grassland birds. This workshop will show you how to design and implement on-the-ground projects ranging in scale from small pollinator gardens on school grounds, to projects of one or more acres along farm fields, ditch banks, solar farms, or power line rights-of-way.

Credits: 2 graduate credits from the UW-Madison with tuition waived. There is a registration fee for the credits.

Includes: New Pollinator Habitat Curriculum Guide, team activities, cross-curricular connections, supplies, resources for the classroom, expert leaders, field trips, and a \$200 stipend.
